## 5<sup>th</sup> PhD Seminar on Wind Energy in Europe

*30<sup>th</sup> September and 1<sup>st</sup> October 2009*

### SEMINAR

This seminar will provide an opportunity for PhD students and their supervisors from all over Europe to exchange information and experiences on wind energy, to meet new people and make new connections. The seminar will include:

- Guest lectures from senior practitioners in the wind energy industry
- A visit to the New and Renewable Energy Centre (40 km away), with its wind turbine blade, electrical and wave testing facilities
- A wide range of contributed papers, presentations and posters
- A social programme including conference dinner

As in previous years, the seminar will be free to attend, but accommodation will need to be paid for.

### CALL FOR PAPERS

It is hoped that as many students as possible will present their work in the form of a short paper, which will be issued in a bound volume to all attendees. The deadline for receipt of papers is 15<sup>th</sup> August 2009. Each student who has submitted a paper will be able to choose his or her own presentation option, from:

- Oral presentation (15 minutes plus questions), or
- Brief oral presentation (10 minutes without questions) plus poster session to follow, or
- Poster session only.

### LOCATION

The small, but ancient city of Durham is a spectacularly beautiful world heritage site containing a lively university. It is located in the north east of England, within 20 km of international airports at Newcastle and at Durham Tees Valley, and within a short distance of attractive coast and hills. The conference will be held at Collingwood College, one of the constituent colleges of the university, where accommodation will be available at a cost of £24.50 per night for a single, en-suite room. A wide range of other accommodation options are available nearby, of which details will be made available.
